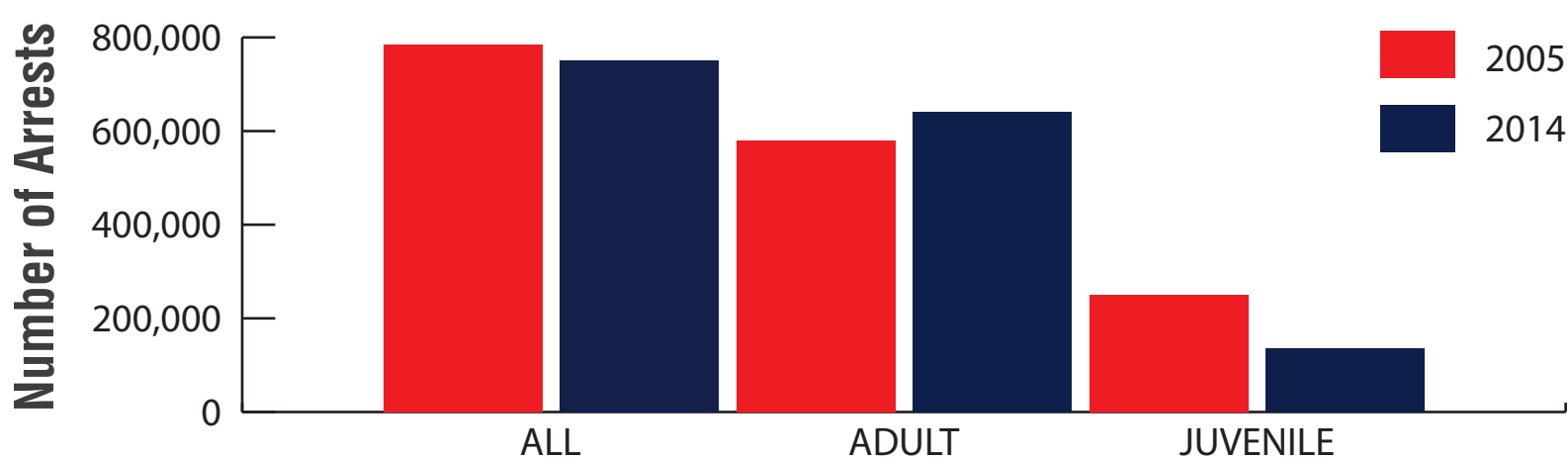


TEN-YEAR ARREST TRENDS

NATIONWIDE ARRESTS DECREASE FROM 2005 TO 2014

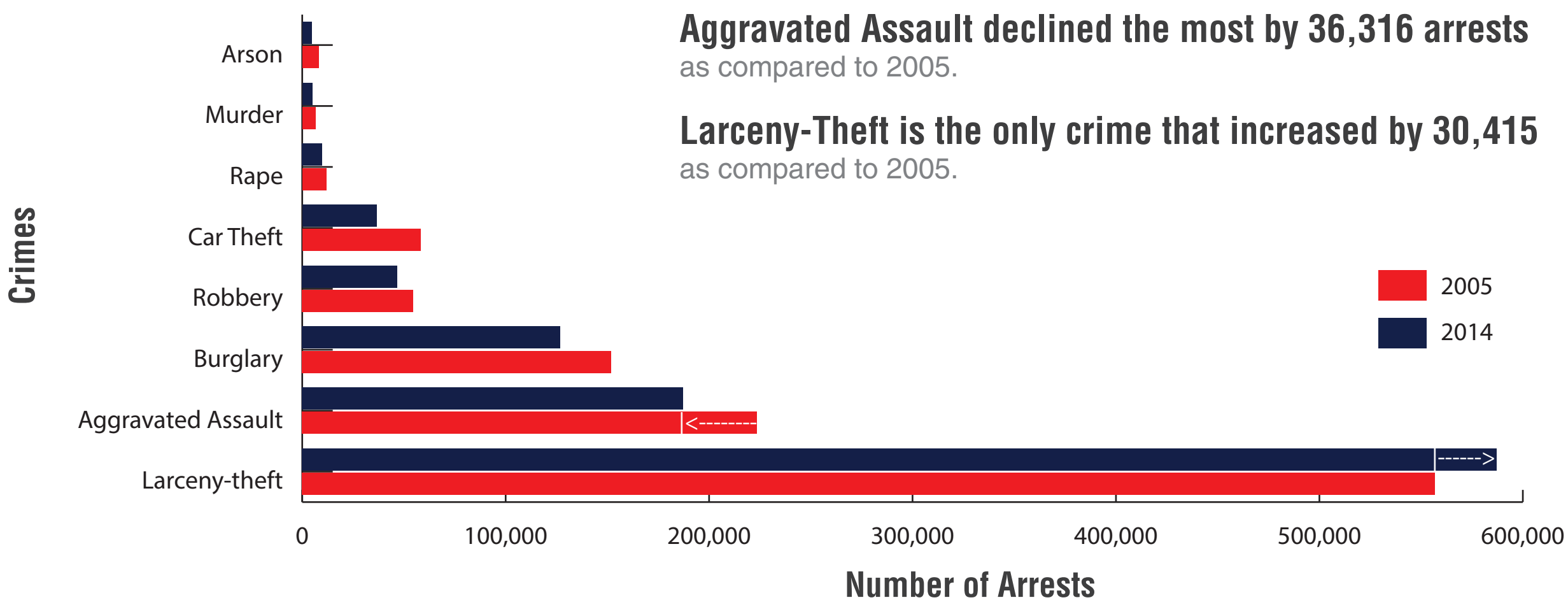


79,543 arrests decreased from 2005 compared to 2014.

113,417 less juvenile arrests in 2014 as compared to 2005.

But adult arrests increased by 33,874 as compared to 2005.

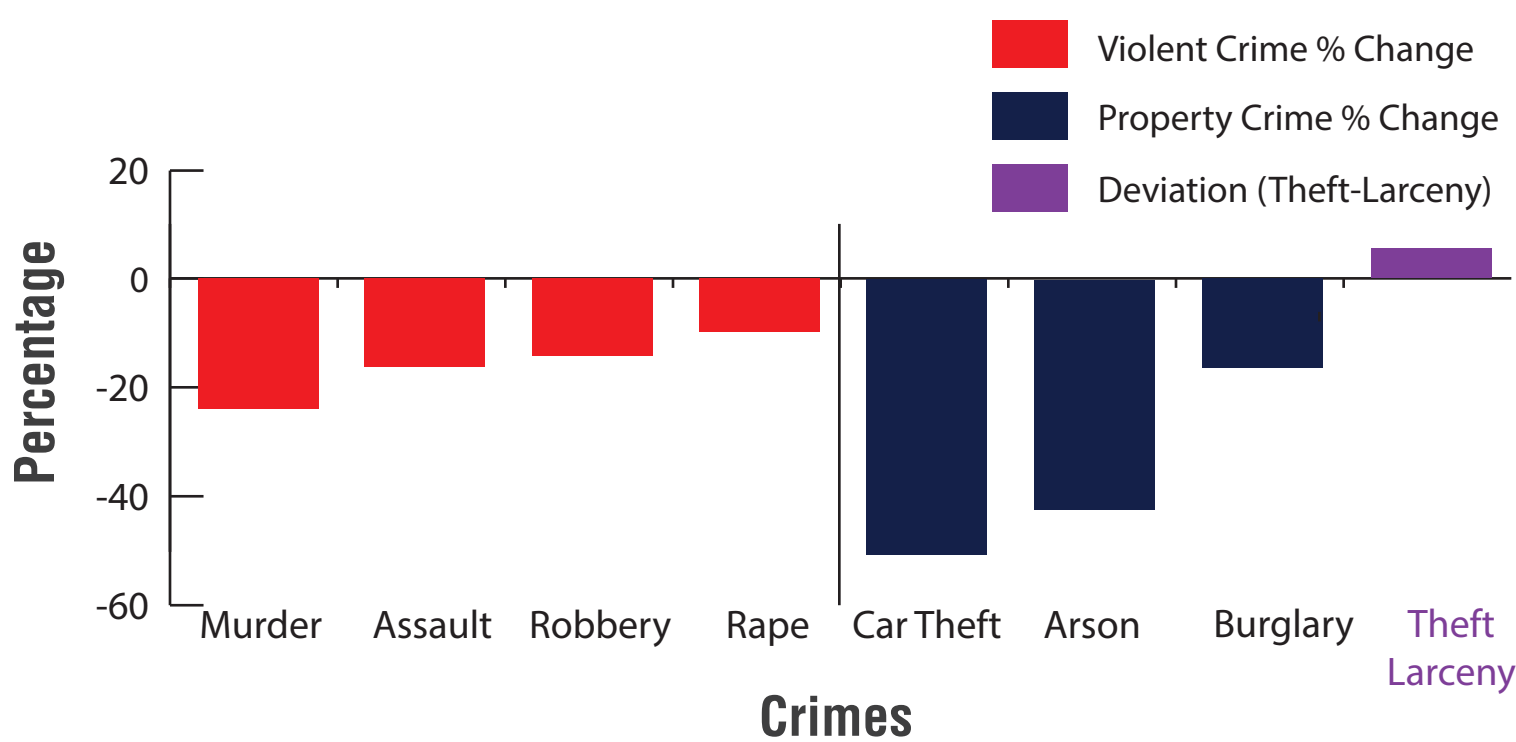
WHAT DECLINED THE MOST IN 2014?



Aggravated Assault declined the most by 36,316 arrests as compared to 2005.

Larceny-Theft is the only crime that increased by 30,415 as compared to 2005.

TOTAL PERCENTAGES DROPPED FROM HIGHEST TO LOWEST

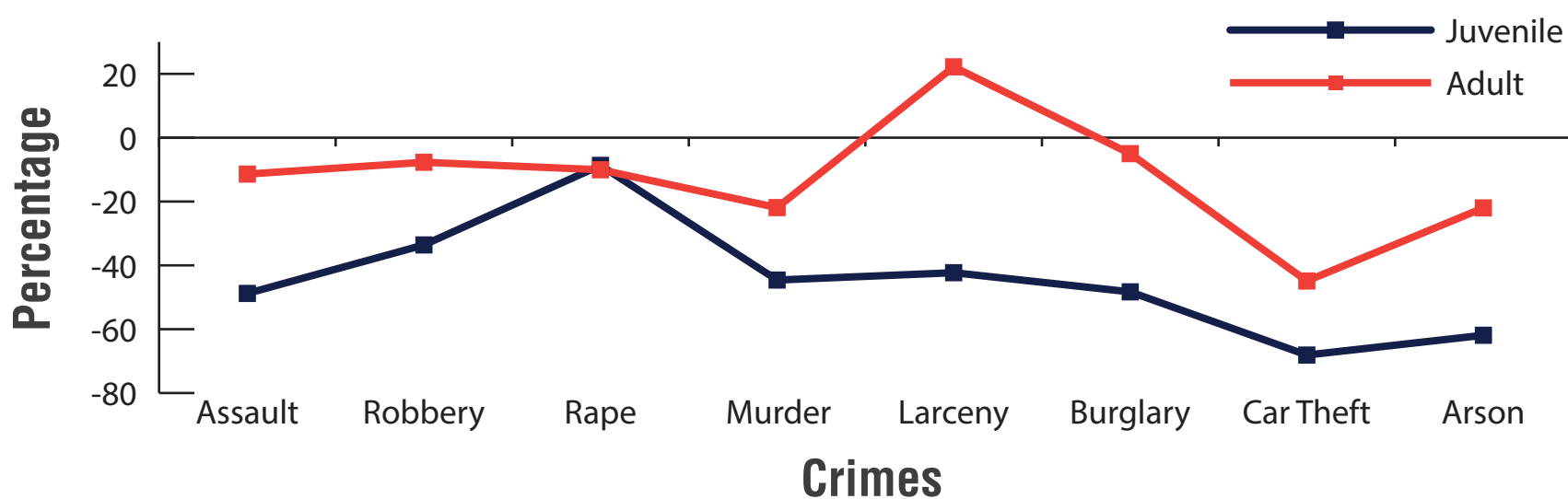


Murder dropped by 24.0% in 2014 among Violent Crimes as compared to 2005.

Car Theft has the largest drop of 50.5% among Property Crimes as compared to 2005.

Larceny-Theft rose by 5.5% in 2014 as compared to 2005.

JUVENILE VS. ADULT PERCENT CHANGE



All juvenile arrests dropped in 2014 as compared to 2005.

Adult Larceny-Theft up in 2014 while the rest of the arrests decreased.

Adult and juvenile show dissimilar patterns suggesting no correlation.

METHODOLOGY

The data used in creating these graphs were from all law enforcement agencies submitting 12 months of arrest data for both 2005 and 2014. The FBI collects them through the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program.

These data represent the number of persons arrested; however, some persons may be arrested more than once during a year. Therefore, the statistics in this page could, in some cases, represent multiple arrests of the same person.
